## CHAPTER XCVI.

An Act to permanently locate the Seat of Justice in the county of Grundy, and for other purposes.

SECTION 1. *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Tennessee,* That the town of Altamont in the county of Grundy, be and the same is hereby established, as the permanent Seat of Justice of Grundy county. Altamont, seat of justice.

SEC. 2. *Be it enacted,* That Greek Brawley, John Fultz, Noah Bass, Robert Tate, Esq. and Thomas Burrus, be and they are hereby appointed commissioners to advertise and sell the lots in said town of Altamont according to the plan of said town, as laid off by the former commissioners, and apply the proceeds of the sale to the construction of the public buildings. Commissioners

SEC. 3. *Be it enacted,* That James Tate be and he is hereby authorized to remove or otherwise dispose of a house which he built on one of the lots in said town of Altamont. James Tate may dispose of house.

SEC. 4. *Be it enacted,* That the several courts in the said county of Grundy, shall be held at the house of Jesse Wooton, until suitable accommodations are provided by the commissioners at the said town of Altamont. Courts—where held.

SEC. 5. *Be it enacted,* That all laws heretofore passed in relation to the county seat of Grundy county, be and the same are hereby repealed, and that all laws, inconsistent with the provisions of this act, be and they are hereby repealed. Former laws repealed.
