Campbell married _____ . Tradition says that he died on his way to America in 1725 and that his wife and children came (landed) in Pennsylvania. (will discuss this later) Tradition said he had:

Robert Campbell

I. Robert Campbell born in County Down, Ireland about 1718 according to tradition in the family, landed in Philadelphia, PA when he was about 7 years old, along with other members of his family and kinfolk. In 1725 he was in Prince Edward Co., VA He married 1. Letitia Crockett in Prince Edward Co. and remained there through at least 1759. Since Robert, Jr. his son gives his birth place as Prince Edward Co. (see Revolutionary File below) Letitia Crockett Campbell must have died in Prince Edward Co. Robert married 2. in Prince Edward CO. Jane Allison. The Crockett family genealogy says that he moved to Rockbridge Co. VA and then went to Carter's Valley in Washington Co., VA which later was Hawkins Co. TN . Robert Sr. died in Hawkins Co. in about 1810.

I-F ALEXANDER Campbell born in Prince Edward Co. VA died in Hawkins Co., TN about 1786 or 1787. Will is in Washington Co. TN Alexander married Amy Eaton who was born _____ and died in 1831. Amy died in Hawkins Co. when she was 35 years old. After William died, Amy married William _____? /THEIR children were:

I-F-1 Robert Campbell born 1772 in Hawkins Co. TN died in July 1828 He married his cousin Jennie Taylor (probably a daughter of Thomas Taylor) Robert and Jennie were married in 1799 in Hawkins Co. and moved to Giles Co. TN near Campbellsville. Jennie lived until after 1875. Descendants of this family are scattered in TN, Mississippi, and Arkansas. They had these children:

I-F-3 James Campbell, son of Alexander, was born _____. He married Sally Humphry of Maury Co. TN and Missouri. James and Sally moved to Missouri and Sally died there. James returned to TN and settled north-east of Columbia, TN He died there about 1857. His children lived in TN and Texas:

For five years they lived at the present site of Lymansville on South Fork of Fountain Creek. Their children were:

THE "BLACK" CAMPBELL GENEALOGY taken from a
report given to me to copy by Mrs. George M. Beaver
a Notary Public and the wife of an attorney.

John Campbell⁷, son of Duncan⁶, was born in November of 1674, on his father's estate, Drumboden seven miles from Londonderry, Ireland. His ancestry had earlier refuged from Inverary, Scotland. He and his wife lived and their nine children were born--six sons and three daughters. He married Grissell (Grace) Hay, daughter of Patrick Hay, in the year 1695. She lived to be 93 years of age. John and Grissell emigrated from Ireland to the Colonies of America in 1729 on either the ship "George and Ann" or "John of Dublin", which left on May 9, 1729; and landed in Pennsylvania on Sept. 4, 1729. They came with their family and a large number of relatives and friends and settled at SWEET ARA in Donegal Township, Lancaster Co. PA. In the year 1737 or 1738 they moved--some of them along with this John and Gissell--to Beverly Manor in what was then Fincastle (later Orange, still later Washington, still later Augusta County) Virginia. They were in the same place all the time in Virginia, but when the counties were divided, their citizenship fell into another county.

In 1730 John purchased a large tract of land, perhaps part of the Borden grant referred to in introduction-said by Governor David Campbell to be in Orange County at that time. Here he lived and died in 1741. William Thompson qualified as administrator of his estate in 1741 (see Waddell: Annals of Augusta County, page 385). His wife, Grissell (Hay) Campbell lived to be 90 years old. She had one brother -Patrick.

In Foote: Schetches of Virginia is printed letters from Governor David Campbell of Montcalm, Augusta County, Virginia (near Abingdon, VA) gives much information about this line. The writer will Quote part. These letters are also found in Draper's Manuscripts.

Letter from Governor Campbell, written Nov. 12, 1851:

"John Campbell, my great grandfather, with his family of 10 or 12 children, came of America in 1726, and first settled in Lancaster Co., Virginia. He had six sons, three of whom, Patrick, Robrt, and David, emigrated with him from PA to what was then Orange, but afterwards Augusta County in about the year 1730. (The actual date was in 1737). Patrick was the eldest son and he was the grandfather of General William Campbell of the Revolution. David was the youngest, and was my grandfather. He married in Augusta Co., VA. Mary Hamilton and had seven sons: John, Arthur, James, William, David, Robert, and Patrick. All, except William (of sons of David) migrated to the Holston..... The other sons of John Campbell had families and their descendants are scattered over many of the States of the West. William B. Campbell, a young man, and lately elected Governor of Tennessee, is my nephew, and is the grandson of Margaret Campbell, one of the daughters of my grandfather, David Campbell.....(speaks here of the Edmiston family) (the Vance family...the Newell and Blackburn families...the Buchanan family...the Christian family...the Logan family...and others)/

Letters from Governor Campbell, of Montcalm, VA dated Nov. 29, 1851:

"John Campbell, the great ancestor of the Campbells of the Hoston, came from Ireland to America, with a family of five grown sons and several daughters in the year of 1726, and first settled in Lancaster, PA. About the year 1730 he removed to what was then Orange, afterwards Augusta where he resided until his death; and where his numerous descendants lived for many years. The Campbells above named were the descendants of his oldest son, Patrick, and his youngest son David.... Patrick had a son Charles who had a son named William who was the Gen. William Campbell of the Revolution, and he was the grandfather of

Mrs. Governor McDowell. David, the youngest son of John Married Mary Hamilton and had a family of 13 children, seven sons and six daughters, the youngest of whom was eleven years old when the family removed to the Holston....In 1765, John, the oldest son of David and Mary Hamilton Campbell, in company with Dr. Thomas Walker, explored the western wilderness, and purchased for his father and himself, an ancient survey near the head-waters of the Holston, called "The Royal Oaks", and a few years afterwards the family removed to it. John and Arthur the two oldest sons, preceded their father and accompanied by one sister, Margaret, and making improvements. The father and mother then followed, accompanied by their sons: James, David, Robert, and Patrick....and their daughters Mary (who was married to William Lockhart) Martha, Sarah, and Ann (who were single). In a few years after this removal, Margaret, who had been a pioneer with her two oldest brothers, married David Campbell, the pioneer who erected Campbell's Station fifteen miles below Knoxville, TN. James lost his eyesight with small-pox and died at the age of 50.... John, Arthur, David, Robert, and Patrick, were active men and rendered some service to their country. John Campbell the eldest son of David was born in 1741....

Governor David then discusses each of David Campbell's sons: John the elderest, David, the fourth brother, Robert, Patrick and the daughter, Margaret. All this part will be incorporated under each individual.

These letters are here to straighten out some of the incorrect information printed and being printed. We find records to show that John Campbell, the elder (married Grissell) was for a time member of the Provential Council of PA from Lancaster which may be of use to those descendants who are descendants who are desirous of becoming Colonial Dames of Colonial Dames of 17th Century organizations.

DISCUSSION OF CHILDREN OF JOHN AND GRISSELL CAMPBELL:

- I Patrick Campbell⁸ oldest son of John and Grissell, according to Gov. David Campbell, was born in Ireland in 1696 and came with his father to Lancaster Co., PA in 1729. He died _____. He married Delilah Thompson. Probably she was the daughter of William Thompson who was the administrator of the Will of Patrick's father, John, the elder. He seems to have been married when he came to the Colonies. He was made constable of the Township soon after coming to America (see Rupp's History of Lancaster Co., PA.) They had four sons and three daughters that we know about.
- IA Charles Campbell Campbell⁹ born in Ireland in 1715, died in Washington Co. VA in March of 1767. In his will dated Aug. 4, 1761 and proved March 17, 1767, he speaks of himself as a resident of "Beverly Manor". He married Margaret Buchanan (some say Sarah Margaret BUCHANAN). In his Will he appoints his wife as sole executor, providing for her support and leaving 100 acres to his son William on the Holston River and lands in the same section to his daughters.

Charles⁹ served in the French and Indian Wars in 1742; was Captain in 1752 and fought at Kings Mtn. in the Revolutionary War (see "Kings Mtn. and Its Heroes) in Draper Manuscript page 380).

William Campbell¹⁰ known as General William Campbell, hero of King's Mtn. fame, was born Sept. 1, 1745 according to Baptismal Records of Rev. John Craig, Pastor of Augusta Church (Old Stone Church), and died August 22, 1781, just before the surrender of the British at Yorktown at the age of 36 years.

Record: Roster of N.C. Soldiers: "William Campbell Campbell" Brigadier General, VA Militia, Dec. 1780; also commanded Shelby's Virginia Militia Regiment during the siege of Yorktown until he died 22nd of Aug. 1781. and:

"Campbell, William (VA), Captain, 1st VA 15th Dec. 1775; resigned 9th Oct. 1776; Col. VA Militia 1777-1780. By the act of 13th Nov. 1780 it was resolved 'That Congress entertain a high sense of the spirited and military ability of Col. Campbell, and the officers and privates of Oct. 7th., in which a complete victory was obtained over superior numbers of the enemy advantageously posted on King's Mtn. in the State of N.C., and that this resolution be published by the Commanding Officer of the Southern Army in General Order.'

Another record of interest to descendants no doubt is this one:

Annals of Southwest Virginia by Lewis Preston Summers, page 1563.

"On a quiet and beautiful Sabbath in the Springtime of the year of 1780 Gen. William Campbell accompanied by his wife and several of his neighbors, attended the religious services at a Presbyterian House of Worship which stood near the residence of the late Capt. James P. Strother, known as the Meed Place, in the upper end of the county. As they were returning home they happened to be discussion on the audacity of the Tory who had been so bold and defiant in his declarations....."

As will be seen from the above quotation, he received a note of thanks from the VA Legislature and the Continental Congress for his skill in the Battle of King's Mtn. where he defeated the British Oct. 7, 1780. He was made Brigadier Gen. after this commendation.

There is an excellent write-up of William Covington on page 124 in Historical Sketches of Campbell, Pilcher, and Kindred Families.

In 1767, at the age of 22, William and his mother and four of his sisters moved to the Holston Valley in Washington Co. VA. His father had just died.

Gen. William Campbell married Elizabeth Henry, sister to Patrick Henry and after Gen. William died in 1781, his widow, Elizabeth married Brigadier Gen. William Russell of VA.

William and Elizabeth are buried in the Preston Cemetery. This is near General William's old home, Aspinvale, at Seven Mile Ford, VA. They had two children:

IA5 Margaret Campbell¹⁰, daughter of Cap. Charles Campbell⁹, married her father's cousin (her 2nd), Col. Arthur Campbell. He was of "Royal Oaks" son of David and Mary Hamilton Campbell. He was an officer in the Colonial and Continental Armies. Arthur, along with his Brother, John, preceded his father to the valley of the Holston in Washington Co. Col. Arthur Campbell was a member of the House of Burgess of VA from the large county of Fincastle which was the original county from which later Orange, WASHINGTON, AND Augusta counties were made.

related here. "Going one day with others to a thicket in search of plums the party was fired upon by the Indians lying in ambush. Young Arthur was slightly wounded and captured. He was taken to the vicinity of the Great Lakes and detained for three years before he made his escape. It was about six years before the Revolution when he moved to the Holston in Washington Co. He was afterwards prominent in the assembly and the State Convention of 1788 as well as during the Revolution. His war record is so well documented in other references it will not be repeated here. Arthur was born Jan. 15, 1844 in Augusta CO. VA (Pincastle) died Aug. 8, 1811 at his home at present-day Middleboro, Kentucky in his 69th year. As a result of his military service he received 1000 acres of land in Kentucky. He was Cap. and Col. in the Revolutionary War. After the war he was a prominent man in the forming of State government for the State of TN and was muchly criticised because he was accused of "giving away VA land for this formation."
